


Shared With a Pal

1. Discover SWAPs history. Do both:
 - a. Talk to an older Girl Scout and find out about how she exchanged and created SWAPs.
 - b. After reviewing the Internet Pledge, do some Internet research about the history of SWAPs and how they have changed.
2. Create a SWAPs collection. Choices – Do one:
 - a. Create fifteen to twenty different types of SWAPs and make a display.
 - b. Create fifteen to twenty different types of SWAPs and make a virtual display.
 - c. Attend a SWAPs event and collect fifteen to twenty different SWAPs.
3. Share With a Pal. Choices – Do one:
 - a. Create a copy of your collection and share it with another Scout.
 - b. Create a “How To” story or video explaining how to create your favorite SWAP. Post it on the Internet (ex: pin it on Pinterest, upload a video to YouTube, post a video on Facebook) or share it with a friend.
 - c. Teach a partner in your troop (or a friend) how to make the SWAPs in your collection.
4. Reinventing SWAPs. Choices – Do one:
 - a. Choose a classic or traditional SWAP and find a way to “reinvent” it – change the way the pin is attached, use a different material, make it less expensively... use your creativity!
 - b. Make a SWAP three different ways to show how it can be reinvented.
 - c. Use one material (such as chenille stems) and reinvent it as three different SWAPs.
5. Connect with Others. Choices – Do one:
 - a. Plan and host a SWAP event and share your collection. (May not be used for the same requirement as 2b – must be a separate event.)

- b. Host a SWAPs tutorial for a younger troop or for other Scouts or leaders at a leadership academy, seminar, enrichment, or Miniversity event.
- c. Create a presentation, book, or video and publish it. (Online publication formats are acceptable.)
